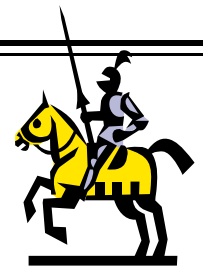

Knights win court battle over pledge

The Knights of Columbus won a major victory in the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals when the court held that the words "under God" in the pledge of allegiance did not violate the Constitution.

The lawsuit had been filed by atheist Michael Nedrow in 2005, just months after the U.S. Supreme Court had thrown out an earlier case on technical grounds.

The court ruling reflected the principal argument made by the Knights, that the reference to God in the pledge reflects a core American belief about the source of fundamental American citizen rights.

So my picture of Lou Brock is back on the wall just as before without an autograph.

Disappointed? Yeah. But Kathy and I made up for the letdown by going to the Ford Center and watching the Thunder on an outdoor screen dominate the Lakers to tie the play-off series and then watching the end of the game at a restaurant.

The incident was just a reminder how little control we have in the events shaping our lives, but we do have the ability to deal with them the best we can. And sometimes, like Maxwell Smart, we come out on top.
